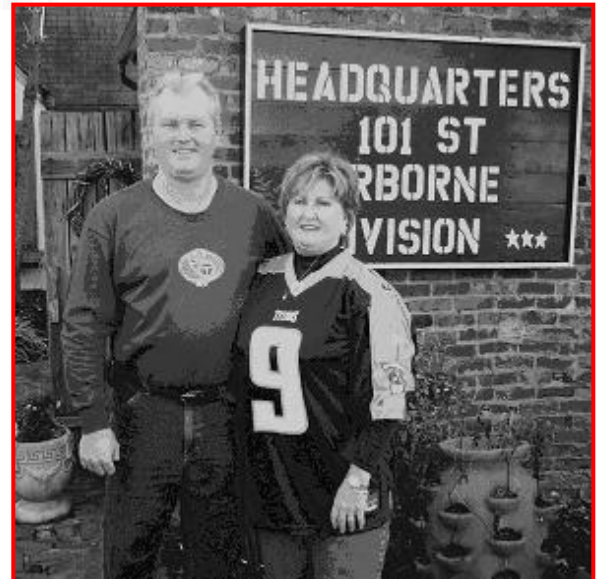


## "Bumper to Bumper"

## Growing Algood gets new Garbage Truck to Keep up with demand

Roger Reed of Algood has a shiny new vehicle to drive these days and it was paid for by cash.

No the 61-year-old sanitation worker did **not** win the lottery.

But in a way, his employer, the City of Algood did.

The new vehicle is Algood's new garbage truck, the first new one they've had in 20 years.

The old one, a 1985 model, was beginning to have a hard time keeping up with the growing population in Algood, officials said. "The old truck has been wrecked," said Algood City Manager Freddie Maxwell. "It's seen it's better days."

The city council decided last year it was time to replace the old 1985 residential garbage truck, which serves about 1,300 households, Maxwell said.

Meanwhile, the old garbage hauling truck will be sidelined, but cleaned up and used periodically to keep it in running condition until it can be auctioned off, Maxwell said.
